



Students will learn how to plan a project, make a warp, dress a loom, weave and finish a 4-shaft sample. Students will learn a variety of weave structures possible with a basic threading. Students will come away from this course with a reference sample and an understanding of what is possible with a 4-shaft loom.

Learn about and experience the process of "How to Set Up a Simple Weaving Project," and see if this is a craft that you might enjoy. Students may use our table looms or bring their own table or rigid heddle loom to class. Students wishing to use our looms will learn about the process of preparing the loom before weaving on a prepared loom to make a 3-4" wide bookmark or art treasure in this workshop. Students who bring their own looms will set them up in class for completion at home (using the instructor's pre-made warp). All participants will learn different methods, patterns and finishing tips. The instructor will contact students prior to class to discuss plans. Beginners and those with some experience can repeat this class for continued learning opportunities.

Weaving Studios

Weaving Studios offer an opportunity for an extended experience in weaving. Instructors serve as mentors, guiding weavers to explore more complex skills and concepts. Students design projects of their own choosing in order to expand knowledge of methods and techniques. Beginning weavers are welcome to join a studio.

For each day and timeframe, two 6 to 9 week sessions run consecutively in each semester. Cost is \$155 to \$223 per session depending on session length.

To be admitted to a Weaving Studio, join the waitlist via our online registration system. Waitlisted students will be informed of openings in Studios on a first come, first served basis. You will remain on the waitlist until you are placed in a Studio or you request to be removed from the waitlist. It may take some time to be admitted to a Studio because the Center has a limited number of dedicated studio looms available. In the meantime, to expand your weaving experience, we encourage you to participate in any of our weaving workshops, or to suggest classes in specific structures or techniques you'd like to learn.

Weaving Workshops

Designing With Fiberworks

4224: Sunday, 5/19, 1:00- 4:00 FEE: \$47 **Registration Deadline: 5/12**

Perhaps you wish to change or embellish a pattern from a magazine or book, but the ideas are all in your head and you are not sure how the completed project will look. This is where Fiberworks shines! In this workshop you will learn how to rearrange threadings, create and borrow tie-ups from other designs, experiment with treadlings, and modify colors. These techniques will give you great freedom in designing your pieces. Students will need to bring note taking supplies and a computer loaded with a version of Fiberworks, either the paid or free demonstration version. The instructor will contact students before the class to discuss what specific aspects of the software they wish to explore.

Satin on Five Shafts

Satin is really only a rearranged twill on five shafts, but oh the difference in its finish! We think of satin as being soft and lustrous which is a result of the longer floats resulting from the tie-up with no diagonal lines. Although it takes ten shafts to weave two blocks, many lovely designs are possible with only one block, using a variety of colors, textures, and treadlings. Students will come to class with looms dressed according to directions sent ahead by the instructor. They will go home armed with a variety of woven samples and detailed instructions and inspirations for future projects. Bring lunch or purchase locally.

Let's start at the beginning with an IDEA! We'll explore preparing your idea for a small weaving in the tapestry manner, using crayons, markers and colored papers. Then we'll prepare the empty frame loom with some strong warp, and get the weaving plan ready to fill in with beautiful colors in wool weft. We'll use the techniques that were explored in Tapestry 101 plus some additional ones to make this new image in uniquely textile methods. Warps and wefts will be provided; additional yarns may be purchased at cost from the instructor.

Transform sheep's wool into your own custom yarn. Handspun yarn can be used in knitting, crocheting, weaving, embroidery, and felting projects, or just lovingly displayed and admired. We'll focus on spinning with a traditional drop spindle and will explore fiber preparation,

drafting, spinning, plying, and finishing our yarn. Bring your own spindle or borrow one of ours! No previous experience required.

Fit to Be Plied!

Your fiber is all spun—but what happens next at your wheel can make your finished item sparkle or sag. Let's explore all the ways that plying can affect color, durability, texture, and ease of completion—whether you're spinning to knit, crochet or weave! Bring your wheel, an assortment of unplied ("singles") yarns, and 3-5 bobbins. If you own a "Lazy Kate," bring that, too. We'll learn Andean plying, chain- or Navajo-plying, and how to make and use a tensioned Lazy Kate for 3- and 4-ply yarns and MORE!

Worsted vs. Woolen: The Long and Short of It!

Come learn combing and carding, and expand your fiber skill set!

Gradient Dyeing

Values from light to dark and nearly invisible transitions from color to color help make our textile work both more subtle and more exciting. This class is geared to weavers—especially tapestry weavers—cross stitchers, and knitters or crocheters who just can't find in commercially dyed yarns the range of color they want and need to express themselves in their work. Students will bring their own pre-made skeins prepared according to directions sent by the instructor and work with the fiber of their choice—wool, silk, cotton, Tencel, embroidery floss—and use synthetic dyes to create their sets, or families, of yarns smoothly graded in value, or color, or both. Previous dyeing experience is not required.

Attention Dyers!

The greatest safety concern when dyeing is inhalation of powders and fumes, which can be lung irritants. While the powders may not be toxic, inhalation can cause respiratory distress or allergic sensitization for certain individuals. Instructors will advise students about sound safety precautions.

Best of all, the silken underlayment can increase your confidence in success, whether you're experimenting for the very first time or an advanced felter looking to stretch your skills! Working with only firmly plied cords and a tool called a grip fid, you'll learn the basics of one of the most popular ways to use ply-splitting as you make at least one—or maybe even more—narrow bands to use as a bookmark, key chain, pull for a light or overhead fan, or..... This ancient and unique technique involves cords moving not over and under one another, not interlooping, but actually going through/splitting one another. Warning: Ply-splitting can be addictive!

Ply-Splitting Goes to POT
